- 3. Do you see parallels between the Ukraine / Russia conflicts of today to Poland's feelings about its more powerful neighbors, Russia and Germany?
- 4. What is the significance of the name "Henryk" as it relates to Aniela's family?
- 5. What significance does Aniela's dancing have throughout this story?
- 6. How is the importance of language demonstrated in this book?
- 7. What does Henryk's outburst regarding his father's disillusionment during the Great War foreshadow?
- 8. What is the significance of With Fire and Sword to the story? Why do you think this book inspired a fight between Aniela and Henryk early in their marriage?
- 9. What do the carvings in the chambers of the Wieliczka Salt Mine tell us about the miners who worked in it?
- 10. How are the differences between city and country people examined in this story?
- 11. How are Poland's attitudes toward foreign affairs and national sovereignty delineated by Aniela's father and Henryk's discussion while Henryk is attending the University?
- 12. What do you make of Aniela's take on teaching dance as a lessor act of resistance than the fighting being done by Henryk? Did you think she should risk teaching dance underground?
- 13. In what ways did Aniela use the traditional understanding of feminine behavior to her advantage?
- 14. Do you think that Irena was working with the resistance?
- 15. What are your thoughts on the degree to which Aniela had to appease her German employer? Specifically, being a companion Herr Neumann's wife?
